THINGS TO DO

A visit to West Cork would not be complete without doing some or all of the following....You're spoilt for choice!

Beaches

West Cork's rugged coastline, tiny coves, golden sands and safe harbours offers a range of beaches that are popular with surfers, swimmers, windsurfers and walkers. Many of our beaches are so secluded it is just you and the Atlantic Ocean. Here is a list of beaches on our doorstep, but if you wish to explore West Cork further you have two more Blue Flag beaches in Barleycove and Tragumna.

Warren Beach:

A very safe sheltered beach to sunbathe and swim, suitable for families. Only 1km from Rosscarbery Causeway and the Celtic Ross Hotel.

Owenahincha Beach:

Blue Flag Beach. A short distance from Rosscarbery, this Blue Flag beach is a long sandy beach. As it is exposed it can get very windy and is a popular spot for surfing.

Long Strand:

Looking out over Galley Head this beach is great to stretch the legs and breathe in the Atlantic air. Not suitable for swimming, a surfer's haven.

Red Strand:

Not far from Long Strand this beach is dotted with rock pools.

Inchydoney Beach:

Blue Flag Beach. Outside of Clonakilty this vast beach is great for surfing.

Drombeg Stone Circle

This is one of the most visited megalithic sites in Ireland and is protected under the National Monuments Act. Known locally as 'Druid's Altar' Drombeg is a Recumbent stone circle. Steeped in history, stone circles were places of ritual and ceremony in the later Bronze Age period (c. 1500 BC - 600 BC) and were usually associated with human burial. Also at the site is a fulacht fiadh or prehistoric cooking site and ruins of oval huts made from standing stones. A must see when in West Cork
